

Overview of Enhanced Services commissioned by Hambleton, Richmondshire and Whitby CCG, North Yorkshire County Council and NHS England

1.0 Introduction

The services provided from GP practices are commissioned in a range of different ways. Nineteen of the local practices are contracted under the standard General Medical Services (GMS) contract. The three remaining practices are contracted under Personal Medical Services contracts. In addition, there are a range of contracts for additional enhanced services provided over and above the core GMS / PMS contracts, commissioned from four different organisations.

The purpose of this paper is to provide an overview of the range of enhanced services to facilitate a more integrated commissioning approach in the Hambleton, Richmondshire and Whitby area.

2.0 Services commissioned by Hambleton, Richmondshire and Whitby CCG.

HRW CCG commissions a broad range of services through an Out-of-Hospital Services contract. The contract is a standard NHS contract across all practices with the over-arching principle that all practices should provide all services (with a few practical exceptions).

All the following services are provided by all practices in the CCG.

- Minor Injuries
- Anticoagulation therapy
- Amber drugs monitoring
- Insulin initiation (in some cases delivered in conjunction with a neighbouring practice)
- Ambulance Service to GP practice triage
- Monitoring stable prostate cancer
- DVT diagnosis and treatment
- Benign Prostatic Hypertrophy presenting with Acute Urinary Retention
- Ring pessary fitting
- Clinical pharmacists in primary care

These services are delivered by a sub-set of practices:

- Complex wound care (delivered by all but three practices which have the service provided by South Tees Hospitals NHS Trust community services)
- 24 hour ECG monitoring (7 hub practices provide the service across the CCG)
- Step-up / down beds (access dependant on where step-up/step-down beds are available)

A summary of the core activity and quality measurements is attached as appendix 1. The pricing structure is listed in appendix 2.

In addition, the CCG commissions a further service through a separate contract for 'Enhanced primary care for Armed Forces Families, Veterans and Dependents'. This applies to Harewood Medical Practice and Catterick Village Surgery and recognises the importance of providing a greater range of services to a population with identified additional needs. The funding for the service equates to the value of the former PMS premium as part of their PMS contracts.

3.0 Services commissioned by NHS England

NHS England commissions five Directed Enhanced Services:

- **Extended Hours** - For practices to provide appointments at times outside of core contracted hours to allow patients to attend appointments at a time when it is more convenient for them. The service is currently provided by 18 GP Practices. The spend in 16/17 was £239,949. This service is distinct from the new Extended Access service which will go live from 3 July 2017.
- **Learning Disabilities** - To encourage practices to identify all patients aged 14 and over with learning disabilities, to maintain a learning disabilities 'health check' register and offer them an annual health check, which will include producing a health action plan. The service is currently provided by 20 GP Practices. The cost in 16/17 was £45,882
- **Minor Surgery** - The enhanced service is for the provision of minor surgical procedures within general practice. The service is currently provided by 21 GP Practices. The cost in 16/17 was £190,531
- **Out of Area** - To support out of area patient registration arrangements. It seeks to secure access to local GP practices for patients living in the practice area but who are registered with a practice away from home without access to home visits. The service is provided by 12 GP Practices.
- **Violent Patient** - To provide a secure environment in which patients who have been violent or aggressive in their GP practice can receive general medical services. In HRW the service is provided by Harewood Medical Practice, Catterick Garrison. The cost in 16/17 for the services was £5,516.

These use standard specifications across the whole of England and practices submit standard reporting data in line with national requirements. The uptake for these services is summarised in Appendix 3.

4.0 Services commissioned by North Yorkshire County Council (NYCC)

The Public Health department with NYCC commissions four enhanced services from local practices. These are:

- NHS Health Checks
- Pharmacological Abstinence Therapy Supervision Service for Alcohol Misuse
- General Practice Based Shared Care Drug Misuse Treatment and Recovery Service
- Targeted Primary Care Sexual Health Service provided in GP Practices

The full list showing service content, payment arrangements and participation is attached as appendix 4.

5.0 Services Commissioned by Public Health England

Public Health England also commissions a further range of services, principally related to vaccinations and immunisations. Again, these are nationally-determined services with national specifications and performance management arrangements.

All 22 practices in HRW are signed up to provide the full range of services listed in appendix 5.

6.0 Recommendations
